Government National Funding Cuts

You may have heard in the news before Christmas, that the funding formula which the government uses to assign budgets to schools is to change. We are currently in a consultation period, however the government has confirmed that a decision on the proposals will be made before the summer. The revised funding formula is far better than the Government's initial proposal, however Mrs Gemmell and the Board of Governors continue to follow the discussion, and ensure that we are planning ahead and anticipating any changes that may arise.

Other news

Promoting Bamford Primary School: We are exploring opportunities to promote the school beyond the Hope Valley. Hope Valley Schools Cluster Initiative: The school continues to work closely with other schools in the valley (including Hope Valley College), developing strong relationships and looking for opportunities to support across the schools. Cluster working is encouraged by the Local Education Authority and is recognised as good practice, maximising best practice and experience across the valley, resulting in positive outcomes for our children.

An example of some of the support initiatives include, joint Continued Professional Development for school staff, sharing views on schools initiatives and cluster moderation across schools which enables us to benchmark across schools and gives us confidence in our moderation process.

Key Stage results: As reported in the last newsletter, the school had received the Key Stage results for EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. Mrs Gemmell, the teaching staff and the Governors having scrutinised the results are pleased to confirm there are no weaknesses in any of our key stage results, with some areas of improvement and strength against national and Derbyshire benchmarks. Further plans to improve and build on these results are identified in the School Improvement Plan. Well done to all the pupils and staff for their hard work.

Forest Schools: The investment is proving really beneficial; the children are really engaged and enjoying the Forest Schools experience. Mrs Coulson and Ms Gartside are working very hard to train and deliver teaching and will shortly be undertaking the final 4 day assessment; such is the level of award and recognition that Forest Schools contributes to learning. Our thanks to them both.

Healthy Schools Community Award: congratulations to the staff for being the first school in the County to receive the Award! Thanks to Mrs Chapman for leading the initiative in school and for submitting the schools 'story' for accreditation. Mrs Chapman will be coming into school to receive the award.

The group welcomes new supporters at any time and I've been informed that a list of planned activities will appear on school notice boards very soon.
